Elders reports Muchea cattle numbers were similar to the previous week's sale with live weight numbers equalling 893 head with calf numbers in the vealer yards in at 893 head. Pastoral cattle were again dominant in the yarding with tighter supplies of locally bred trade cattle, weaners and cows penned.

Processor demand continued to be strong on the limited supplies of prime finished trade cattle. The small numbers of weaners and store local yearlings showed little change in their demand and values, while pastoral store heifer values were very buoyant recording strong values to local graziers.

The cow market saw another easing in values despite selected individual lots peaking at 376c/kg. Most sales in pastoral and local drafts saw values constrict by 10c/kg.

Processor demand for heavy weight bulls was similar while live export and export feeder demand remained in line with the previous week's quotations.
